

Introduction on Reporting Participation in "Part-time Jobs" for International Students

When participating in part-time jobs, international exchange students (D-2) must obtain permission through their school from the Jeonju Immigration Office. Engaging in activities without proper authorization is considered 'illegal employment' and may result in penalties under the Immigration Control Law.

- ▶ Undergraduate or Graduate program International and Exchange Students (D-2)
 - Must have received a minimum grade of C (2.0 GPA) in the most recent semester as of the application date.
 - ** Exclusion: students who have obtained permission for additional semesters because of not meeting graduation requirements, being in the process of writing a thesis, or have not acquire TOPIK score etc.

English Track Program Language Proficiency Exemption: Acceptable if meeting the criteria of TOEFL 530 (CBT 197, iBT 71), IELTS 5.5, CEFR B2, TEPS 601 points (NEW TEPS 327 points), regardless of the grade

>> Limited part-time Job

▶ Private tutoring, riders in delivery service company, long-distance (over 1 hour), manufacturing, seasonal work, entertainment establishments, and activities outside the status of an international student (However, Students with TOPIK Level 4 or above are allowed in manufacturing)

*** Exemptions from Hourly Employment Permit**

- Working for a temporary basis, prizes, or on campus assistantships, work-study students etc. If it is not done in the range that doesn't include.
- ▶ Receiving compensation for temporary daily housework assistance or office support, police interpretation, advisory or counseling services, participation in events, temporary appearances in movies or broadcasts (single and non-continuous), and other similar activities.


The procedure for applying for part-time work permits and information on penalties

>> Penalty for Illegal Part-time Work

- * Students who work in the field of construction for illegal employment will be expelled regardless of the number of offenses without exceptions.
- * Those who have received warnings, penalties, or fines totaling more than 2 million won within the last 3 years for violations of the Immigration Control Act (failure to report part-time work, etc.) are not allowed to change their visa to D-10 (Job Seeking Visa) after graduation
